Is Your Liquidated Damages Clause Valid?

Should you include a liquidated damages provision in your contract? If you have such a clause in your contract, and completion of the project has been delayed, will it give you the relief you seek? Let's take a look at some factors that will help you figure out the value of a liquidated damages clause.

What are liquidated damages?

In general, liquidated damages are an amount of predetermined, stipulated compensation to be recovered upon the occurrence of a particular event. They are often associated with delays on a project. The purpose of having a liquidated damages provision is to establish a pre-set amount of payment to address circumstances where damages are hard to determine or otherwise difficult to prove.

Why would you include a liquidated damages provision in your contract?

There are a few reasons that come to mind:

- you prefer the certainty of the stipulated amount to the risk, cost and uncertainty of proving actual damages, or
- one party makes it a part of contract negotiations, and you link it to getting something in return, such as an early completion bonus.

It pays to be careful when drafting a liquidated damages clause.

Just because your contract has a LIQUIDATED DAMAGES section, it does not mean that it is a valid clause or that you will recover under it. For example, the pre-set liquidated damages amount must be a *reasonable* estimation of the damages that would occur in the event of a breach. If the stipulated amount is not reasonably related to the potential damages, then it will be considered a penalty, and it will be unenforceable.

This is an important point. Even if both parties agree to include the clause in their contract, it may not be enforceable. While the freedom to bargain for and agree upon terms is a bedrock of contract negotiations, the law of liquidated damages puts some limits on this freedom.

One case tells a very instructive story. Despite the parties' apparent agreement to include a liquidated damages clause in their contract – after all, it was in their contract -- the party seeking to enforce the clause could not offer a reasonable explanation of *why* the parties included the clause and *how* the liquidated damages amount was calculated. On this basis, the court rejected the provision, saying it was not reasonable and calling it a penalty.

What is a reasonable liquidated damages provision?

Remember, whether the liquidated damages are reasonable is not affected by the amount of actual damages incurred because the

analysis is based on the circumstances existing at the time the parties enter the contract. Accordingly, the following factors are relevant to determining what is reasonable under the circumstances:

- whether the clause is buried in boilerplate language or was freely negotiated,
- what the contracting parties thought at the time they entered the contract,
- the degree to which the contracting parties had knowledge about what might happen in the event of a breach, and
- the degree to which there is a reasonable explanation for how the stipulated sum was chosen.

In one case involving the construction of a church, the pastor of the church testified that the amount of liquidated damages, \$250.00 per day, related to the anticipated loss of donations or offering, tuition for a private school affiliated with the church, and the increased costs of building the church as time progressed. When considering whether to award liquidated damages, the court found that these factors supported the liquidated damages amount.

One last thing to consider is why there was delay in the first place. Even if you have a valid liquidated damages provision in your contract, you may not recover under it. If you, too, delayed the completion of the project or otherwise breached the contract, the court will consider your conduct when evaluating the merits of applying the provision.

Last week was rejected due to lack of dates by signatures. This is a moving target and we need to stay in front of it. Too frequently, I have maps or corner records or cert. of correction, etc, coming in without dates, seals, signatures, etc. I try to catch most everything, but I will be taking a harder stance on problematic documents. Please check your own work prior to submitting mylars or final docs.

Please **do not put** witness my hand and seal on maps. Only **witness my hand** is needed (see 66436(a) (4) (c) of the SMA). When a notary seals the mylars, which is not required, the seal has to be 100% clear. On Monday, one of the maps from a local engineering and Surveying firm that we tried to record got rejected by the County recorder because the seal which was not needed was illegible. We had to take it back and call the notary and erase the seal off the mylars. Please let surveyors know to instruct the notary that the seal is not needed and to ensure that **witness my hand** is the only thing on maps. Thanks!

I recently received my "passing" results for becoming a newly Professional Land Surveyor (LS 8392). Back in 1999, Bob Leger hired me into RICK Engineering, and gave me a chance to really pave my own road for Land Surveying. He enlightened me on such a variety of things, from a personal level, to business, fishing etc. (Actually he sold me my first 2 fishing rods, that I still use today). All of us who worked with Bob, (if you agreed with him, or disagreed with him) - you always knew where he stood. He was very up front and honest, and taught many of us the "in's and out's" of business. He shared so much with us, and with our working core of people during my time at RICK Engineering, will forever be locked away in my very fond memories. My daughter is the same age as his first granddaughter, and we would come into work in the mornings, and share pictures each day, and talk about "something new" that they had did over the weekend. I will cherish these fun times with him.

The point of my story is.....I had received my LS results, and had written a "Thank You" card, to each person that I felt was a direct reason on how I achieved this great thing. Bob Leger was within my first 3-4 cards, thanking him for allowing me the opportunity in working for him, and letting me into his Survey Department (which opened up a great number of doors). I have many personal friends that I still talk to, and feel like I am a better person in knowing these people. Bob gave me a chance.....which then allowed me to work with these people....which in turn helped me learn so much (personally and business)....which in turned pushed me to the next level....which in turn, lead me to where I am today (which is owning my own Company).

I hand wrote nearly 25 Thank You cards, and sealed them all..... and sadly.....I never sent 1 card. All I needed was a few addresses, or maybe some stamps.....and I bundled them all up, and never sent him my card. He never got to read my Thank You card. I have had it on my kitchen drawer for 4-5 months now, and actually forgot about the cards, until I heard this sad news.

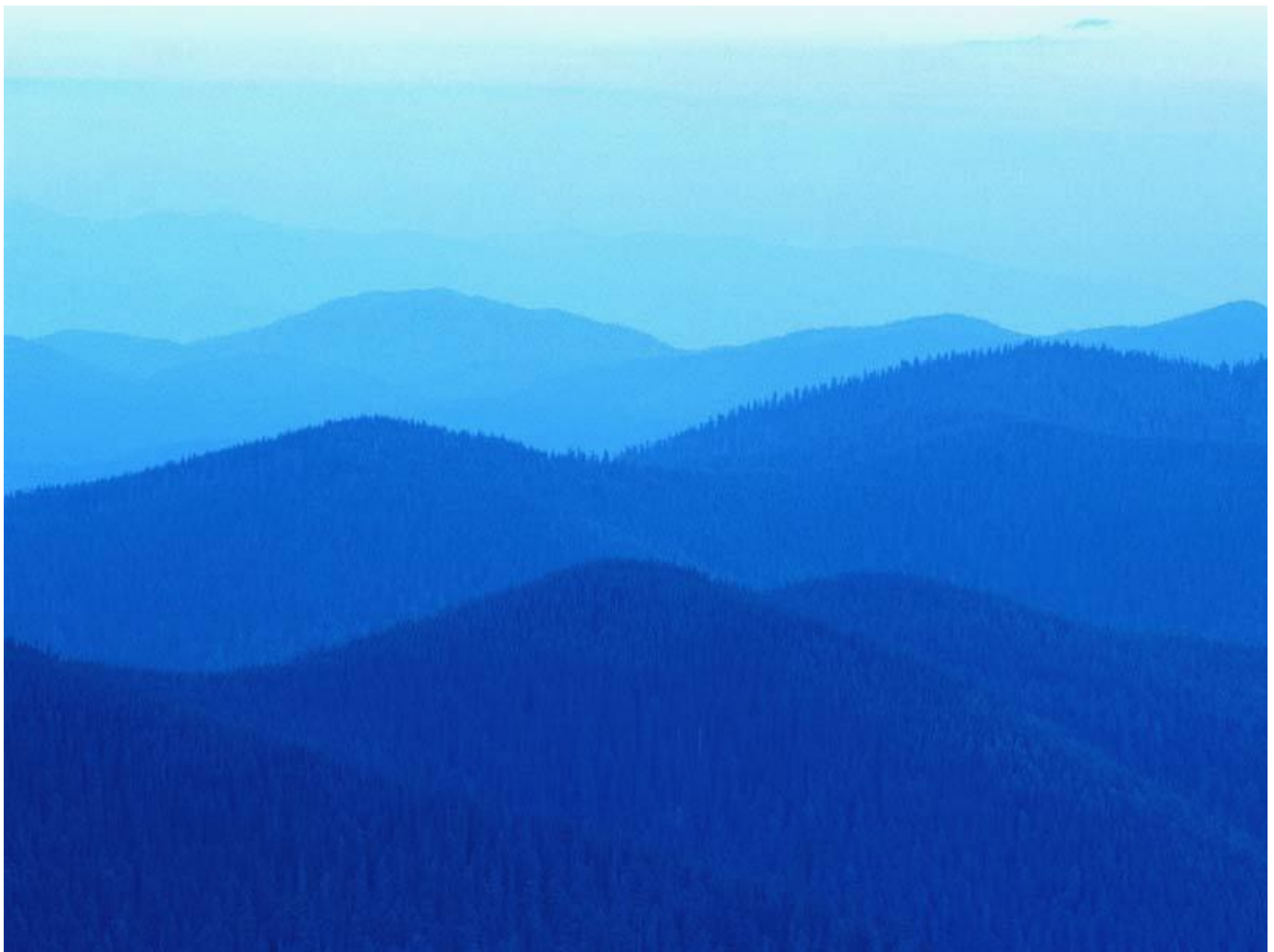
(Crackpot Justin.....nickname by Bob Leger)
